SWE Scholarship Program Did you know?

- Annually, SWE awards individual scholarships to freshmen through graduate students
- Scholarships and fellowships range from \$1,000 to \$10,000 each
- In 2003, SWE national scholarship distributions were over \$250,000
- Many professional SWE sections offer additional scholarships

The SWE Scholarship Program provides financial assistance to women admitted to accredited baccalaureate or graduate programs, in preparation for careers in engineering, engineering technology and computer science. Accordingly, SWE scholarships are investments in students' potential to succeed as engineers, academics and leaders.
